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## Wendy Scott Scholarship

Established 2019

Wendy Scott joined the Bolton Public Schools teaching staff in 1986 after teaching “Home Economics” in Illinois for 6 years. In her 33 years at Bolton High School, Wendy expanded the Family and Consumer Sciences program and created new courses for the students to explore.

Wendy currently teaches three college level courses that have been articulated with Manchester Community College and one course in the Early College Experience Program with the University of Connecticut.

In 2003 Wendy started the Playschool program, a student run preschool for children ages 3-5, which was created to give early childhood education students the opportunity for a hands on experience interacting and teaching children. She has also given culinary students the opportunity to bake and prepare meals for staff and others in the community. One example is the “Cookie Taste Testing Contest” held annually for Bolton senior citizens.
